CEO MESSAGE

I'm pleased to report yet another record-breaking year for the Utah Local Governments Trust and its members. Fifty entities joined our pooled programs in 2016, including: St. George City, Logan City, Utah Municipal Power Agency, and 47 others. Member retention has been above 99% for more than five years. Last year, the Trust trimmed operating expenses by more than \$1,600,000, a reduction of 8%. We expanded coverage and are providing more services than ever before. We returned \$3,000,000 to members in dividends and rate stabilization, and strengthened our net position by \$3,510,656.


The Trust helps you achieve your goals to reduce loss and injury. If results are better than actuarial projections, members reap the reward through dividends, premium subsidies, more coverage for less premium, and increased financial security.

Since 1974, the Trust has provided specialized insurance products and services to Utah's local governments. Today, the Trust has insuring relationships with 540 members: 89% of Utah's Cities

and Towns; 72% of Utah's Special Districts, and 38% of Utah's Counties. We compete directly with the commercial market and other insurance providers. We deliver what they cannot. Members have options. Still, 99% of members renewed their partnership with the Trust in 2016, but only after carefully evaluating several key factors: financial security, coverage, loss prevention, and overall cost of risk.

Our results tell the story best. We listen to members and respond to changing needs. We will continue to lead with innovation, accountability, and discipline – making course corrections along the way. In his New York Times bestseller, "Good to Great," Jim Collins said "Good companies are good at change, and great companies are great at change." At the Trust, we believe this – we live this.

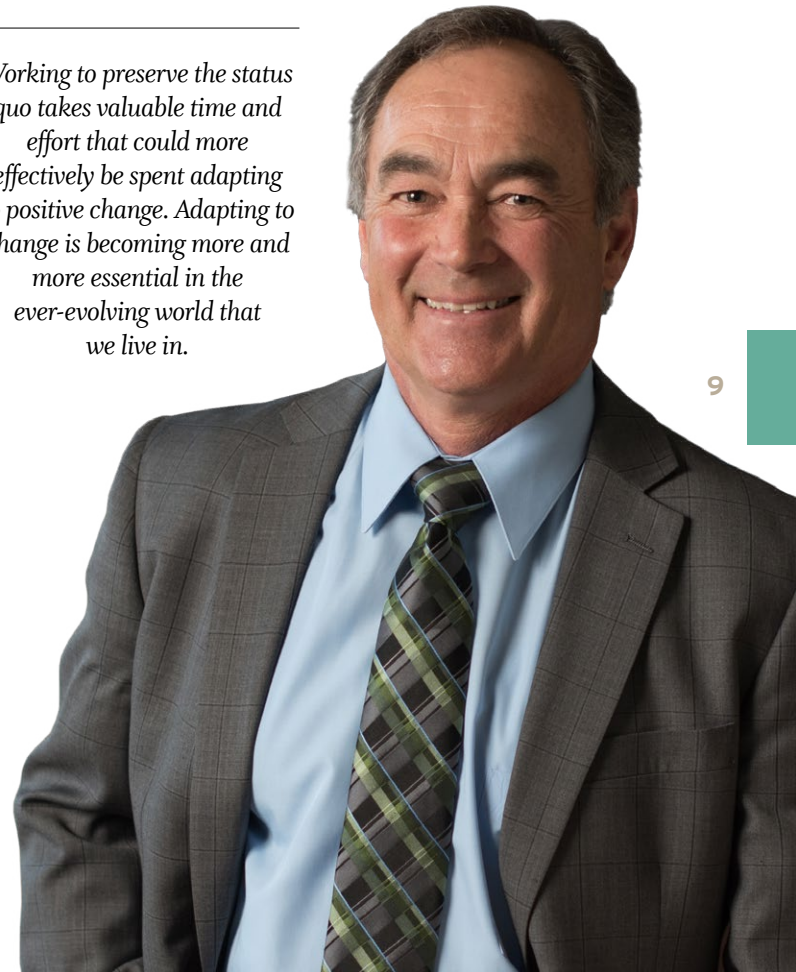

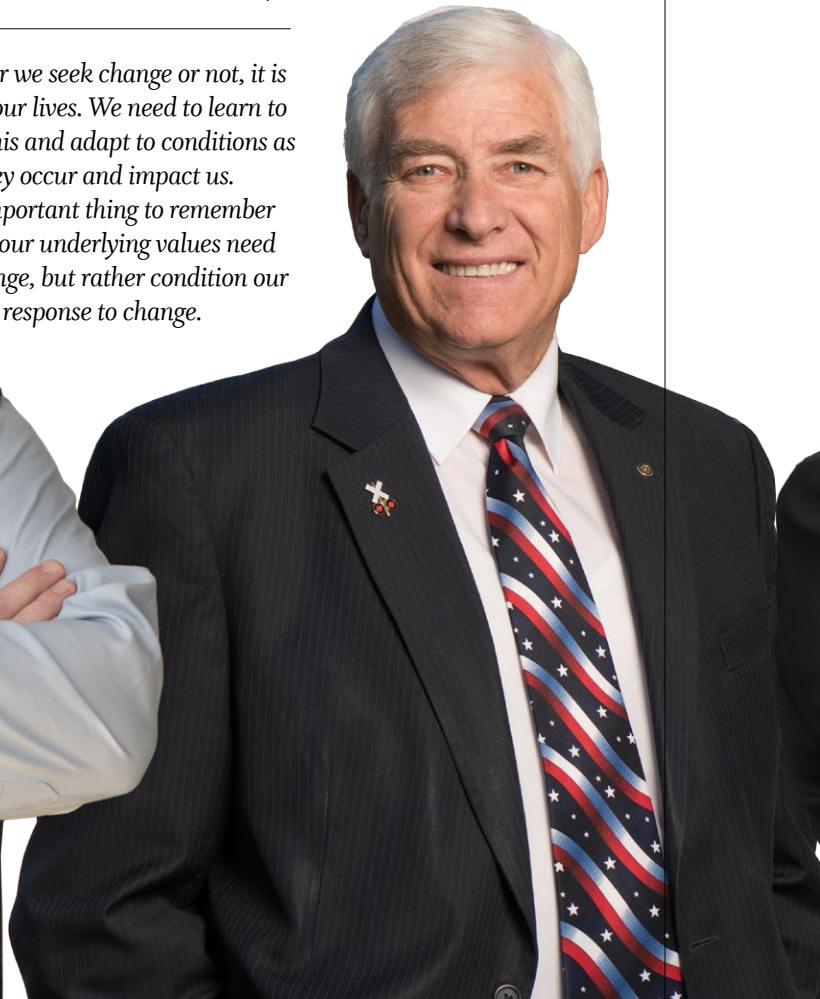

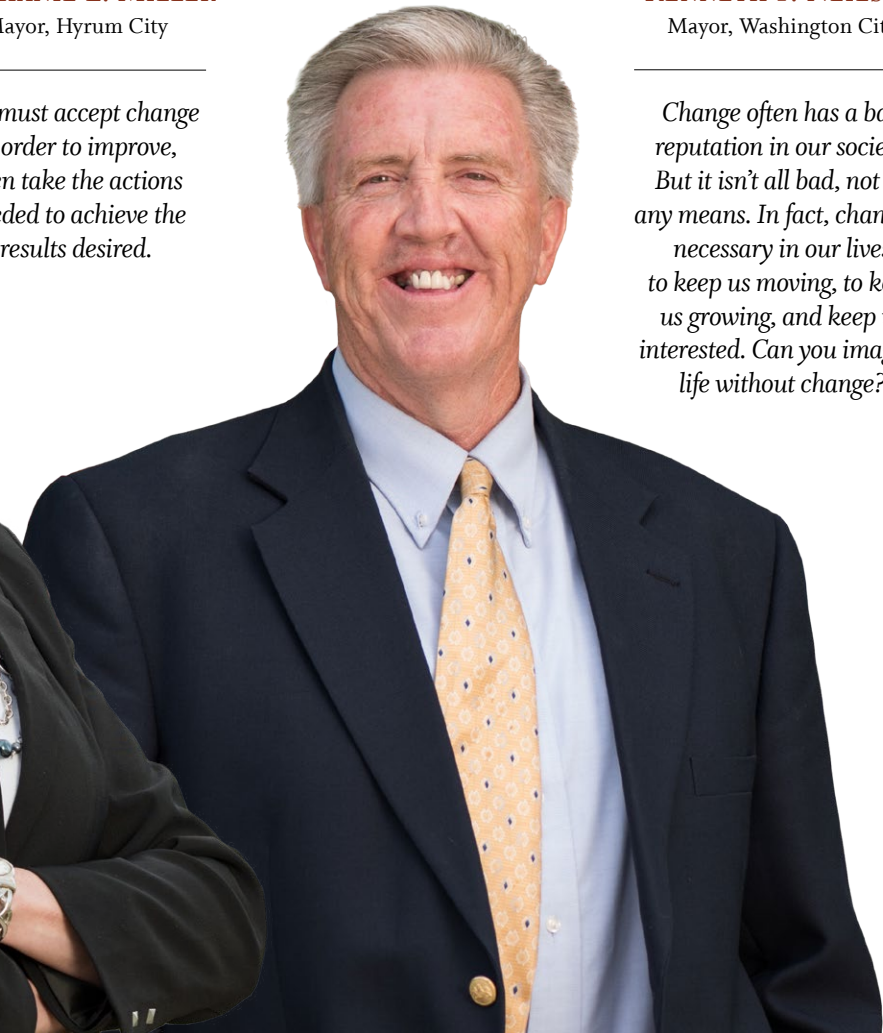
